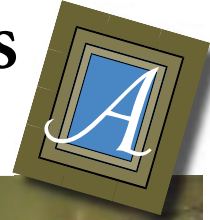

Manhattan-Style Art Is Exhibited In Bellevue



American art collectors first saw Mihail Chemiakin's works in early 1980s after his "Paris Period" followed by the exile from the USSR in 1971. From the beginning, Chemiakin's work elicited enormous enthusiasm from a large spectrum of American art lovers. Despite the often specifically Russian subject matter and aesthetic tradition of many of his works, viewers reacted strongly to the brilliantly daring colors, meticulously drafted compositions and pure artistic values of Chemiakin's oeuvre. Chemiakin's works were acquired by Metropolitan Museum of Art, Museum of Modern Art of the City of Paris, The State Russian Museum, Jane Voorhees Zimmerli Museum, Rutgers University, NJ, Yokohama 21st Century Museum of Art in



Japan and many other museums worldwide.

Fine Art Vision Gallery currently exhibits and sells many paintings, watercolors, gouaches and sculptures by Mihail Chemiakin as well as paintings by front-line non-conformist artists. The art arrived from a private collection and is exhibited till June
